Eligibility Children between the ages of 6–12 that reside in Onondaga and Oswego Counties are eligible.

Application There are **no fees** involved to have your child in the program. BBBS encourages parents and guardians to contact the program to enroll their children. Even though, other youth agencies can make referrals, **only the child’s parent(s) and/or legal guardian can complete the application** and interview process.

Volunteer Information Volunteer mentors must complete an application, provide three character references and submit to a Criminal Background Check. There is an interview process, which takes place either at home or at the office.

Services Foster Grandparents spend 20 hours each week at local elementary schools, daycare centers, Head Start sites, hospitals, detention centers and group homes. Serving as positive role models, Foster Grandparents give one-to-one attention, encouragement and support to children needing assistance in overcoming physical, mental, social, emotional and academic obstacles.

Eligibility Foster Grandparents must be 55 years of age and older, in good health, able to serve a minimum of 20 hours a week, have access to reliable transportation and meet federal eligibility requirements. Applicants must complete criminal history background check.

Volunteer Foster Grandparents receive an hourly stipend of \$2.65. The stipend is tax free and cannot be counted as income to reduce benefits such as SSI, Medicaid, rent subsidies, food stamps and other senior benefits. All transportation expenses associated with their FGP assignment are reimbursed. Foster Grandparents must complete 20 hours of pre-service orientation prior to placement.

Services This program delivers energy efficiency and energy-use education to participants in the National Grid and New York State Electric and Gas Company (NYSEG) low-income programs. The goal is to make a household more energy efficient by reducing electric usage and thereby reducing electric bills.

The type of work this program provides is lighting efficiency, replacement of refrigerators, freezers, hot water heaters and other electric appliances with more energy efficient models, conversion of electric clothes dryers and hot water heaters with natural gas models, air sealing, insulating of the walls and/or attic, and heating system service and repairs.

Eligibility Homeowners who participate in low-income programs through National Grid or NYSEG.

Services This program offers financial incentives to developers, building owners and managers of residential multi-family buildings for capital projects involving energy efficiency improvements.

As a Multifamily Performance Partner, our role is to assist in the application process, perform an energy audit, design an Energy Reduction Plan to include an energy performance target for the building, and then to monitor the implementation of the plan to ensure that the energy performance target is met.

Eligibility The project must be a multi-family, residential building with 5 or more units. Participants or their tenants/shareholders must pay the Systems Benefits Charge, and must be customers of one of the following utilities: Central Hudson Gas & Electric Corp., Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc., New York State Electric & Gas Corporation, National Grid, Orange and Rockland Utilities, Inc., Rochester Gas and Electric Corporation. If the building contains non-residential commercial space, at least 50% of the gross heated square footage of the entire building must be devoted to residential space.

Services The Weatherization Assistance program provides energy saving home improvements such as insulation, repair or replacement of water heaters and heating systems, weather-stripping, and air sealing to eligible residents of Onondaga & Oswego Counties.

Eligibility This program is open to Onondaga & Oswego county residents who earn less than 60% of the state median income. Any applicants who are eligible for H.E.A.P. are also eligible for the Weatherization Assistance Program.

Application Please call or e-mail to request an application. We require 4 weeks proof of income for all household members, proof of ownership of the building, and a recent copy of the applicant's fuel bill. There is currently an 18 month waiting list after the application has been approved before we can provide services. At the end of the 18 month waiting period, one of our energy auditors will assess the building to determine which home improvements are necessary to ensure the health and safety of the residents, and which are the most cost effective measures required to make the home more energy efficient.
