The following is a report for the Big Brothers Big Sisters program activities for the month of June, 2017:

There are currently a total of 66 open matches through the Community-Based/Traditional program. This past month, 2 new matches were made and no matches were closed. The current waiting/applicant list has increased to 86 children, with the following breakdown:

Girl's Applicant list: 8 - Waiting list: 22
Boy's Applicant list: 22 - Waiting list: 34

Big Brothers Big Sisters Director and Program Assistant attended a Data Measurement Training at PEACE Inc. to learn about program reporting and develop program plans for BBBS.

BBBS program Director attended the Action Leadership meeting at the main office at PEACE Inc.

Big Brothers Big Sisters program was invited to be at the Greater Leadership of Syracuse Annual class gathering at the Salvation Army. BBBS Director made a program overview & opportunities to volunteer presentation to the 60 members of the class. About 15 volunteer applications were picked up by those who came to our information table and expressed an interest in volunteering with BBBS.

BBBS Program Director met with representatives from O'Brien & Gere and made a Corporate-based overview presentation, going over details of how the program ran at BNY Mellon and the same efforts could be duplicated at O'Brien & Gere. There's a possibility that in the future, they may become our second Corporate-Based partner.

“Bigs” and “littles” attended a Syracuse Chiefs’ baseball game at the NBT Bank - Stadium. Matches were provided with game tickets and a \$5 concession coupon. In addition, an informational table was staffed by BBBS staff for recruitment purposes.

Big Brothers Big Sisters program has received notification from the office of Senator John DeFrancisco that an LMI for the amount of \$20,000 has been secured by his office for our program. These funds would be utilized to cover costs for the School-based transportation.

A check for the amount of \$12,000 was received from Lockheed Martin as part of their annual sponsorship of Bowl For Kids’ Sake.

The BNY Mellon Corporation has secured another grant for \$25,000 for the Big Brothers Big Sisters Corporate- Based program to continue at their site. Conversations are already in place to secure mentors and a presentation to recruit more volunteers.

BBBS program has received notification of program sponsorship from the Johnathan Ben Snow Foundation for the upcoming School-Based Mentoring year in the amount of \$10,000.

BBBS program Director attended the CLP at the Frank DeFrancisco’s Community Center in Eastwood.
