CALL TO ORDER:

The October 13, 2021 Planning Committee meeting called to order at 4:53 PM by Chair Shirley Copes. It was noted for the record that a quorum was present.

APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MINUTES (April 2021)

Chairperson Copes requested a motion to approve the September 2021 minutes. The motion was moved by Paula Freedman and seconded by Elizabeth Hakanson, and was unanimously approved.

PRESENTATION

HS/EHS - 2021-2022 School Readiness Goals

Holly Hastings, the Head Start & Early Head Start Child Development and Health Services (CDHS) Manager, presented the 2021-2022 School Readiness Goals to the Planning Board for their approval. Five School Readiness Goals have been identified based upon Spring data from Teaching Strategies GOLD (our child assessment tool); class room observations; and in consideration of the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on meeting the social emotional needs of our children. A brief summary of each goal is below.

Goal one is "individualizing for all children to insure the full and effective participation in the program." It examines the individualization process to support each child's social-emotional, language, literacy, math, cognition and gross/fine motor development. Education staff and home-based visitors have received an introduction to the Planned Language Approach; Developmentally Appropriate Practice; and Universal Design in Learning through trainings by our regional Head Start education specialist and our in-house child development specialist. Along with this information and use of the data from Teaching Strategies GOLD, staff will have the tools necessary to individualize lessons, activities, and materials for each child.

Our second goal is under the domain of Social Emotional Development. It focuses on children developing expectations of consistent, positive interactions through secure relationships with adults using a trauma informed approach. It also encompasses children using basic problem solving skills to resolve conflicts with other children. This is a carryover goal from last year given our program (and community) is still coping with the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Our third School Readiness goal is under the domain of Language and Communication Development. It focuses on enhancing the quality and amount of language modeling used by teachers through their use of language stimulation and language facilitation techniques to encourage children's language and communication development.

Goal four falls under the domain of Literacy Development. It emphasizes children developing a positive attitude towards books and enjoyment of reading when being read to by adults. As appreciation for books and reading develop, children begin to show awareness of concepts of print, comprehension and emergent reading skills. Early exposure to reading and hearing the written word through various parts of the day increases literacy skills as a precursor to discrimination sounds, such as alliteration and rhyming. An increase of language modeling lends to an increase of reading books aloud to children and hence, goal four complements Goal three.

Goal 5 is a carryover from the previous year's School Readiness Goals and is in the domain of Cognition/Mathematics. Specifically it focuses on helping our Head Start children to be able to identify number names, count in sequence, recognize the numbers in of objects in a small set, and understand the relationship between numbers and quantities. Staff will provide developmentally appropriate mathematics activities for the children to manipulate and explore to enhance skills in these areas.

Elizabeth Hakanson moved to approve the 2021-2022 School Readiness Goals report, the motion was seconded by Paula Freedman, and was approved.

School Readiness Goals 2021 - 2022**

1. Individualizing for all children to insure the full and effective participation in the program.

Staff will use the Head Start Early Learning Outcome Framework Birth to Five (HSELOF), Approaches to Learning Domain, to ensure the full and effective participation of children. Staff will include data from Teaching Strategies Gold Reports to assist in individualizing learning for children. (HSPS 1302.30, 1302.31; HSELOF Approaches To Learning; Teaching Strategies Gold [TSG] Observations, TSG Classroom Profile).

- Children will benefit from program services that ensure the effective participation of all children with focus on individualizing instruction for children's language, cognitive, motor, and social emotional needs.
- Staff will promote school readiness for all children and engagement of their families.
- Parents and staff will collaborate to promote the development of a positive classroom culture and individual approaches to learning for all children and their families.
- The program will assist staff to increase their understanding of individualizing instruction for children through training and technical assistance opportunities.
- Measurement and assessment: Teaching Strategy Gold online assessment system.

2. Social Emotional Development HSELOF Goal IT- SE 1, 2, 3; P-SE 3, 4, 5

Child develops expectations of consistent, positive interactions through secure relationship with adults using a Trauma Informed Approach and uses basic problem solving skills to resolve conflicts with other children. (TSG obj. 2a, b, c, d, 3b)

- Children will develop skills necessary to foster secure attachments with adults, build peer relationships, regulate own emotions and behaviors, and develop an understanding of how to think through problems and apply strategies for solving them.
- Staff will assist children to practice skills to increase Protective Factors and support social emotional functioning in a classroom or home setting, through creating a School Family and responding to children's emotional needs through providing positive language and appropriate activities utilizing Conscious Discipline, and other available resources.

- Parents and staff will work together to increase children's social emotional development by discussing Conscious Discipline and sharing DECA Strengths for Living and Learning and Teaching Strategies Gold developmental levels, and develop appropriate goals.
- The program will assist staff in their understanding of building a social emotional foundation using an agency-wide approach with Conscious Discipline to build resilient early childhood settings.
- Measurement and assessment: Teaching Strategies Gold, DECA Strengths for Living and Learning, CLASS Tool, Conscious Discipline Implementation Check List and observations notes.

3. Language and Communication Development HSELOF Goal IT-LC4, 5, 6, 7, 8; P-LC1, 2, 6

Language Modeling captures the quality and amount of the teacher's use of language-stimulation and language facilitated techniques to encourage children's language and communication development. (TSG obj. 8a, 9d, 10a, b)

- Children will develop language and communication skills through language modeling techniques with the teachers.
- Staff will assist children in increasing their language and communication development through supporting language use with active frequent conversations, back and forth exchanges, open-ended questioning, repetition and extension, self and parallel talk, and advanced language.
- Parents and staff will work together to increase children's language and communication development by discussing their child's Teaching Strategies Gold developmental levels and develop appropriate goals.
- The program will assist staff to increase their understanding of building children's language and communication skills through coaching, training, and technical assistance opportunities.
- Measurement and assessment: Toddler CLASS, Preschool CLASS, Teaching Strategies Gold

4. Literacy Development HSELOF Goal IT-LC10, 11, 12; P-LIT2, 5

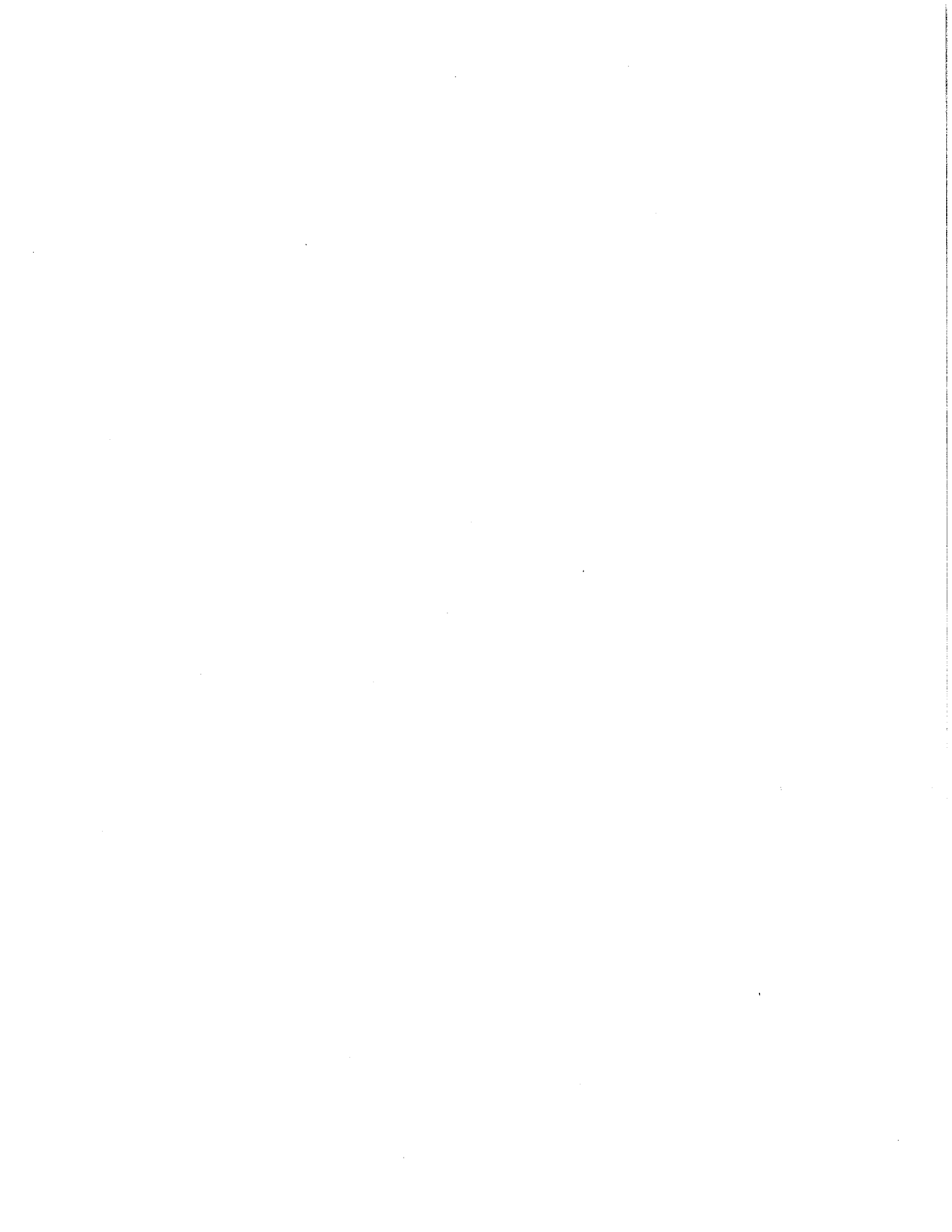
Children will develop a positive attitude towards books and an enjoyment of reading when being read to by adults. As an appreciation for books and reading develop, children begin to show awareness of concepts of print, comprehension and emergent reading skills. (TSG obj. 17a, b, 18a, b)

- Children will develop a positive attitude towards books and reading to guide emergent reading skills.
- Staff will assist children in increasing literacy skills by providing numerous read aloud opportunities throughout the program day including, large group, small group, and individual settings
- Parents and staff will work together to increase children's literacy skills by discussing Teaching Strategies Gold developmental levels and develop appropriate goals.
- Program will assist staff to increase their understanding of building children's literacy knowledge, interest, and skills through training and/or technical assistance opportunities.
- Measurement and assessment: Teaching Strategies Gold

5. Cognition/Mathematics Development HSELOF Goal IT-C 8, 9, 10; Goal P-MATH 1-3

Child will explore same/different, math vocabulary, quantity of objects and identify number names, count in sequence, recognize the numbers of objects in a small set, and understand the relationship between numbers and quantities. (TSG obj. 20a, b, c)

- Children will develop a conceptual understanding of numbers, their relationships, combinations, and operations.
- Staff will assist children in increasing mathematical skills by providing developmentally appropriate activities to encourage environmental math conversation throughout the day, manipulate and explore numbers, numeracy, counting, and cardinality.
- Parents and staff will work together to increase children's mathematic skills by discussing Teaching Strategies Gold developmental levels and develop appropriate goals.
- Program will assist staff to increase their understanding of building children's math knowledge, interest, and skills through training and/or technical assistance opportunities.
- Measurement and assessment: Teaching Strategies Gold
