P.E.A.C.E., Inc. is always looking for enthusiastic individuals who are eager to help us achieve our goals. The following programs are provided by P.E.A.C.E., Inc. and **each one of them could use a helping hand!**

**Big Brothers Big Sisters**

BBBS is a mentoring program that matches a child, ages 6 to 12 years old, with an adult volunteer or trained college student. Volunteers spend 8-10 hours per month mentoring a child.

**Eastwood Community Center**

This center offers a number of programs and activities for seniors, including nutritious lunches, exercise classes, celebrations and more. Volunteers enjoy socializing with one another while contributing to community-based programs such as seasonal clothing drives and the Adopt-A-Family Holiday Giving Program.

**Family Resource Centers**

With seven locations throughout Onondaga County, these centers offer crisis intervention, family development, youth activities and other services for the entire family. Volunteers participate in community activities such as parenting classes, financial literacy instruction, seasonal holiday celebrations, clothing drives and after-school & summer programs for children.

**Foster Grandparents**

Senior citizens share their lifetime of skills and experience with special needs children. Serving as positive role models, foster grandparents give one on one attention to children needing assistance and nurturing.

**Keeping it Cool...Kids between School (K.I.C.K.S.) Camp**

K.I.C.K.S Camp offers a full day of entertaining and educational activities for children ages K through 5. Camp sessions run during winter, spring and summer breaks.

**Head Start/ Early Head Start**

Two comprehensive family focused child development programs that together serve children ages birth through five years old. Families benefit from child development opportunities that encourage the development of physical, emotional, cognitive and social skills. Volunteers can offer classroom assistance, organize resources and help to plan and implement special events.

**Technology Effort for Community Households (T.E.C.H.)**

The T.E.C.H. Program places refurbished computers into the homes of low income families throughout Onondaga County.

**Food Services/Senior Nutrition**

Food Services prepares lunches for seniors over 60 years of age at over 20 nutrition sites throughout Onondaga County. This program provides seniors with a nutritional meal and an opportunity to socialize.

**Project R.O.S.E.**

This service provides social interaction, medical information and referrals to isolated homebound seniors.

**Project Connection**

This dynamic community center provides activities such as tutoring, after school recreation, and computer access to children over five years of age.
